Our Vision: To nurture and protect the land as a sacred inheritance for future generations. “Fostering a harmonious balance between human activity and the natural world through sustainable practices and deep cultural respect”.

Our Mission: To serve as kaitiaki for the land. We commit to preserving our ecosystem, to keep our native biodiversity natural and empower our people in regenerative practices that ensure the well-being of both people and environment.

Principles: Guardianship, sustainability and respect for self, others and environment.

Flag Representation:

Lion: Strength, courage, leadership and protection.

Crown: Acknowledges that we are all leaders, noble and royal by birth.

Green: Symbol of life, renewal and growth.

Yellow: Symbol of hope and enlightenment.

Red: Symbol of Energy, determination and vitality.

Black: Symbol of protection and grounding.

Traditions:

- Each Year there is a cultural parade on the main street of Jah Rastafarite
- It is traditional to go to the lake and watch fireworks with your family each year to celebrate Jah
- Once a month you can go to the moon pool to cleanse your body and mind

EXAMPLES OF OUR RASTAFARMENT

How leaders are chosen:

Elections: citizens vote for their preferred candidate^{-riki}

Appointment: a higher authority or council appoints a leader

Rotation: leadership roles are rotated among members of a group

How laws are created:

Proposal: an idea for the new law is suggested by a government official, citizen, or group^{-te awa}

Debate: members of the legislative body discuss and debate the bill

Publication: the new law is officially published and made available to the public

Signature: the higher authority signs bill into law^{-rawiri}

How are decisions made:

Communicating with the legislative council (Tame)

Voting on whether to accept or reject laws (Tame)

Signing laws and policies into effect (Wiremu)

Communicating with the president (Wiremu)

DEMOCRACY

Democracy is a system of government in which state power is vested in the people or the general population of a state. Under a minimalist definition of democracy, rulers are elected through competitive elections while more expansive definitions link democracy to guarantees of civil liberties and human rights in addition to competitive elections.

In our society we have Representative democracy.

A democracy in which the people elect representatives is known as a representative democracy. A federal presidential republic governs the United States, a unitary semi-presidential republic governs France, a federal parliamentary republic governs Germany, and a unitary parliamentary constitutional monarchy governs the United Kingdom—all of which are examples of contemporary Western-style democracies operating as some form of representative democracy. This contrasts with direct democracy, in which citizens vote for laws or policies without the involvement of representative.
